



ITF WORLD TENNIS NUMBER UPDATE

On **Wednesday 26th July 2023** the ITF will make **important adjustments to the World Tennis Number calculation to ensure it remains accurate**. These enhancements will be for **both Singles and Doubles** World Tennis Numbers and are being made to **increase the accuracy and fairness** when an ITF World Tennis Number is used **in competitive events**. These improvements will also ensure that **players** from all over the world are **more accurately aligned** particularly with regard to different **age groups**. The improved accuracy will also provide greater confidence for players when self-selecting any opponents to play.

While LTA player numbers are likely to be adjusted and move in either direction, their latest number will be more aligned to the age group they are competing within.

The match data of eleven more tennis Federations will also be added into the algorithm calculation on the 26th of These will be the Federations of Spain, Moldova, Paraguay, Uruguay, Argentina, Switzerland, India, Central American & Caribbean Tennis Confederation, Venezuela, Tunisia, and Confederation of African Tennis. If an LTA player has a match record in these nations or has historic opponents from these nations, there may be small enhancements to their ITF World Tennis Number.
